This is a working speedometer on all locos or drivers ride cars. Initial discussion is that this is reasonable easy to achieve in the bigger scales however may be less so in the smaller gauges. There are however several methods for accurate speed indication. Bike speedos that require a magnet fixed to the inside of a loco or ride car wheel are cheap and once calibrated give excellent speed indication.

There are also free GPS based speed indicators available free off the Internet for use in mobile phones. These are excellent for railways that are "in the open" but suffer from interference when in wooded areas.

So, once again, may I on behalf of your Executive, wish everyone the very best for the remainder of 2022 and look forward with enthusiasm to 2023.

There will be no longer a travellers list but a list of all loco and trollies in the country. The certificate has been modernised and will now be about 4 pages. We will still need your trolley and loco lists for the main data base and will let you know more as information comes to hand.
