My current personal projects of priority are restoring a Massey Ferguson 65 tractor and rebuilding the motion gear in one of my locos



## 3. Amusement Device Applications.

There are several clubs that are needing a new Amusement Device Certification this year. It is up to clubs to check when their old certificate expires. Please check your club certificate to see if your A.D. Certificate is due this year for renewal. Worksafe have started sending me reminders, so I will forward onto the clubs when they do. It is up to the club to arrange a MEANZ auditor and if you get in touch, I can send the present list of auditors. Once your club is audited and the auditor is happy you have passed, then they will send your audit to a Lead auditor for moderation. When the audit moderation is passed, you can then send to meanz.secretary@gmail.com the required information. The form 1, the form 2a, a good pic of your club station with locos in and the required lists of loco and trolleys in your club is required. The club has to pay the \$34.50 with the clubs AD number as reference to the WorkSafe bank account. Do not send the money to the MEANZ bank account. I will send the application to WorkSafe and they apparently have a team meeting to discuss and then when approved, they will send out your club Amusement Device Certificate. Please get all members to read the rules on this. There is a MEANZ form "How to apply for your Amusement Device Certificate" and I am happy to send this out to clubs.
